Dear Parents and Carers,

We are well and truly into the swing of the Summer Term now and the children are all working incredibly hard. The focus and concentration of the youngest children while they mixed paint to create different colours was a joy to behold one afternoon this week, as was the focus and thoughtful responses to a book being shared in Class Three. Every child has made progress since the start of the school year and they are continuing to do so. It's not all about work in the classroom however, and the footballers from Class Three are looking forward to their first football match this evening: a local derby with Umberleigh! We'll let you know how they get on next week.

This week in Collective Worship we have been thinking more about Service, with a focus on how this relates to respect. The children thought about how we show respect through acts of kindness, thoughtfulness and by looking after one another no matter what our individual differences are. I was so impressed with what they said - very much a reflection of how each of the children live out each day in school, showing a caring and considerate attitude to one another and a pride in their surroundings.

It has been saddening to discover that some older children in the village have been upsetting children from the school as they 'play out' after 3:30pm. We know that children 'fall out', but these incidences seem more akin to bullying than simple squabbles. I hope that this negative behaviour will stop and that the children from our school will be able to make the most of the longer evenings and nicer weather in their community without being picked on or upset.

Already this term, staff have been busy out of class with Mrs Laurence helping out with Swimbridge's Ofsted, and both Miss Trofa and myself being involved in various interviews for posts around the trust. Whilst these occasions do take us out of the classroom, they also provide important opportunities to work with colleagues across the trust and gain valuable experience that helps us to improve High Bick. Staff here have a wealth of experience and it is important that we can contribute to TEAM's development as well as that of the school itself. We will keep you posted on new appointments just as soon as we can.

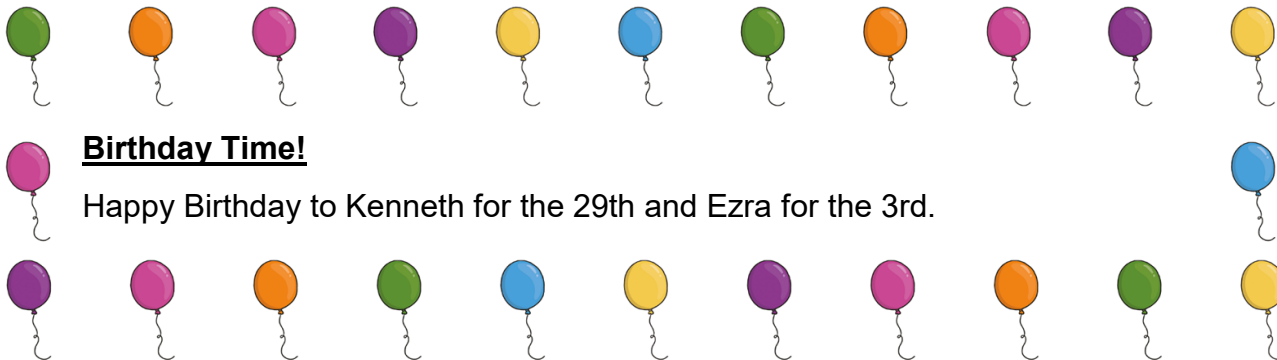

Can you write a story about a castle?

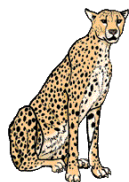


Inventive Impalas (Class Three)

Class One

What a lot of busy bees class one has been this week! Our book of the week is Supertato, by Sue Hendra which has inspired us to learn about food. We've been investigating which foods are good to eat a lot of because they are healthy and ones that we should eat in moderation. The children have even been designing healthy lunchboxes. Our role play garden centre is finally ready to open its doors to new customers and employees. The children have been very creative with thinking of idea of what we need and how to set this up. Our maths learning this week has seen us explore numbers all the way to 20. We have been learning that 'teen' numbers are always a ten and a bit more. The reception children have loved all of our big number challenges!



Class Two

In Class Two this week, the children have continued to explore our topic 'Towers, Tunnels and Turrets', considering any prior knowledge they may have finding out about castles across the ages. Year Two have immersed themselves within the story of Rapunzel and have been learning new vocabulary and discovering an alternative version of the story. In RE the children have been thinking about 'news'. They have considered how we hear 'News' and have discussed whether news can be good or bad. The children have thought about how Christians believe Jesus is good news and shared good news of their own. The children will be focusing on Sculpture this term in Art and they have started learning about Andy Goldsworthy and how he uses nature to create 3D pieces.

Class Three—Frankie and Megan

In science, Class 3 have been learning about sedimentary rocks and how they are formed. Some sedimentary rocks are limestone, mudstone, sandstone, clay and chalk. You can also find fossils in sedimentary rocks. In English we have been learning about how to identify different sentence types, for example questions, commands, statements and exclamations. A questions could be "did the Egyptians invent 60 minute clocks?" In topic we have been learning about Ancient Sumer and how they were the first civilisation. The Sumarians invented a clay board to carve into and write, they invented skyscrapers, roads, cities and the wheeled chariot.

Class Four

Throughout the week, we have been working on lots more maths! We are revising our knowledge about calculating with fractions as well as how to find percentages of different amounts. Year Sixes are becoming very proficient with all of their maths! In RE we are learning about Hinduism and the life-styles of people who are Hindus. We have learnt about 'karma' and how Hindus believe that you can be reincarnated as an animal. Today, we have enjoyed a visit from two local lifeguards. They came to school in the large truck that they use on the beach and talked to us about how to be safe when we visit the beach. We learnt that if you are caught in a rip current you are likely to panic and your heart rate will rise so you must tip your head back and put your chest out to stay afloat. Once you are calmer reach up as high as you can and wave one arm with a clenched fist. On Thursday, we had Teams call with Sanjivini school in Mumbai in India. The children told us about their school and life in India. We then told them about our school and life in High Bickington. We are now contacting our pen-pals via gmail. Next week we are looking forward to some more maths!

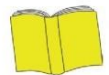

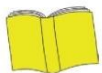
