



Early Years Education Funding



Information for Parents

What is the Early Years Education Funding?

All three- and four-year-olds can get up to 570 hours of free early years education per year. Your child will become eligible for free early years education in the term following your child's third birthday.

Some two-year-olds are also eligible. You will need to check whether you can get the free early years education for your two-year-old. To do this you will need your National Insurance number, date of birth, name and child's details. Eligibility can be checked online at www.devon.gov.uk/2gether (or an assisted application can be made by phone where necessary. Please call 0345 155 1013). If you have a child:

- with a statement or Education, Health and Care Plan
- or your child has left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order,
- or is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance

How do I get the Early Years Education Funding?

Your early years provider will collect information about your child. You will need to discuss the sessions available and agree funded and chargeable time that you wish to book. Your early years provider will claim the funding from Devon County Council.

When can I access the Early Years Education Funding?

This is often taken as 15 hours per week for 38 weeks a year during school term time. However, it can be taken as less hours per week all year round.

You can use a minimum of 2.5 hours and a maximum of 10 hours a day between 7am and 7pm. You can use a minimum of 2.5 hours and a maximum of 15 hours per week. This can be shared between two providers.

Ask your childcare provider how they are offering the entitlement to early years education funding.
